Project 3 An exhibition of painting and sculpture by young artists from various European countries, including three artists from our region.	Project 4 A concert of classical music featuring an internationally famous pianist.
Project 5 A fashion show featuring the work of small, little-known, alternative designers from various countries.	Project 6 An exhibition of traditional arts and crafts from our region: embroidery, pottery, objects carved in wood, etc.
Project 7 An exhibition documenting the history and cultural presence of ethnic minorities in our region. The exhibition would be accompanied by talks by local historians, and possibly also by a book.	Project 8 Art workshops for children, run by professional artists and using a variety of materials and techniques.
